Clear evidence of impact of Pupil Premium Spend

- Achievement of Pupil Premium pupils is above that of all pupils. This is as a result of the consistent approach to the teaching of phonics from Year R-Y1.
- By the end of Key Stage 2 Pupil premium pupils achieve as well as or better than all pupils

Areas for improvement

- Continue to close the gap between all pupils and Pupil Premium for achieving a Good Level of Development
- Continue to close the gap between all pupils and Pupil Premium for those achieving age related expectations at the end of Key Stage 1 in reading, writing and mathematics
- Continue to close the gap between all pupils and Pupil Premium that achieve greater depth in writing at the end of Key Stage 2
- Continue to diminish the gap between Pupil Premium and all pupils in Year 4 and Year 5 (Year 5 and Year 6 in 2018-2019)
